## Let's Make Injustice History

According to Gary Haugen, President and CEO of International Justice Mission [www.ijm.ca](http://www.ijm.ca), injustice is defined in the Bible as a particular kind of sin. It is about the abuse of power to take from other people the good things that God intended for them - things like their dignity, freedom, even their very lives, basic rights that every human being has been given by God.

The Bible teaches that Jesus can be found in our world today and one of the places He can be found is in the faces of the "least" of these that suffer injustice in our world today. Some Christians might say, "Justice isn't really my thing." According to this week's passage, Jesus would say, "Well then, I'm not your thing either."

This passage from Matthew tells us that the difference between an eternity blessed by God and one that is cursed is what people did and didn't \_\_\_\_\_!
