What can I include in my shoebox?
Here are some suggestions.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or pencil crayons, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Toys: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yoyos, skipping ropes, small Etch-A-Sketch®, Slinky®, etc.

Hygiene Items: toothbrush, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc. (due to customs regulations, no toothpaste or liquids).

Other: candy (hard through the centre, in manufacturer's packaging), T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, etc.

A Personal Note: in a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family.
